AWARD OF MOORE COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY MEDAL

Rules Governing

Chairman of each Section in the North Carolina Medical Society shall appoint a committee of three, none of whom presented a paper or are connected with anyone who did so, to select a paper from that section to be presented to the Committee on Award. Papers presented in General Sessions shall be considered as belonging to the Section of which essayist is a member.

In accordance with this procedure it has been determined by the committee that each Chairman shall appoint a committee from his section to consider papers on the Section Program and advise their Chairman which paper in their opinion is most meritorious. The selection of this committee shall be forwarded through the Secretary of the State Medical Society to the chairman of the Committee on Award of Moore County Medical Society Medal for their final decision.

The above outline of procedure will be followed with such modifications as will make it more easily workable in the future awards of this medal.

No physician except a Fellow of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, in good standing, shall be eligible to receive the award.

BY-LAWS, CHAPTER 111, SECTION 4

No address or paper before the Society except that of the President shall occupy more than fifteen minutes in its delivery; and no member shall speaker longer than five minutes, nor more than once on any subject; provided that the terms of this section shall not apply to invited guests.
