RALEIGH — CITY OF OAKS

Raleigh, the gracious capital of the State of North Carolina, was established on land bought by the State for its seat of government in 1792. State Senator William Christmas, a civil engineer under General Washington, laid off plans for the city. The name "Raleigh" was given to honor Sir Walter Raleigh, whose ill-fated colony settled on the coast in 1587.

The first capitol building, located at the corner of Hargett and Harrington streets, was occupied by the General Assembly in 1794; the building was improved later, and a magnificent statue of Washington by the Italian sculptor, Canova, was placed in its rotunda. Fire destroyed the structure in 1831, and the statue was lost. The cornerstone of the present capitol was laid July 4, 1833; it was hailed as the finest example of Doric architecture in America. A Scotsman, David Paton, was the architect.

The original plan of the city has been symmetrically and artistically preserved in the city's numerous expansions. Many of the streets perpetuate names of Carolina patriots, as well as principal towns and counties of the State.

General Sherman's army entered Raleigh, April 13, 1865, as the Confederates retreated. Fortifications had been thrown up around the town, but to avert disaster, the city was unconditionally surrendered and was spared the fate of other Southern capitals.

A tablet on Fayetteville Street marks the spot where Andrew Johnson, 17th President of the United States was born; the house occupied by his parents during his infancy is a public museum on property adjoining the State College campus.

Keeping pace with the great State it represents, Raleigh is growing rapidly. Its population now stands at 71,300.
