DURHAM

Durham, the City of Industry, Education, and Medicine, is relatively a young city, having celebrated its centennial seven years ago. Following the War Between the States, Durham was a small and insignificant point on the North Carolina Railroad inhabited by less than 100 persons. Today Durham is the center of a bustling, forward-looking community of 100,000 people.

One of the most historic events in the history of the nation took place near Durham in April 1865. In a log cabin known as the Bennett Place, General Joseph E. Johnson, commander of the Confederate Armies of the Carolinas, Georgia, and Florida met General William T. Sherman, commander of the Federal Army, and signed a peace agreement which brought fighting to an end.

Tobacco has been the foundation of Durham's economy and the Duke family was the guiding light in this fast growing industry. From the days of Bull Durham and Duke's Mixture to today's twenty-seven brands of Liggett and Myers Tobacco Company and American Tobacco Company, Durham has been the tobacco capital.

In 1892 Trinity College, now Duke University, was brought to Durham. Today Duke has a physical plant worth 55 million dollars, 5600 students, and a 700 bed hospital, and ranks among the leading educational institutions of the nation. Durham is one of the South's chief medical centers.

In 1913, Durham County became one of the pioneers in county-wide public health services when it created a joint City-County Health Department. Prior to that year, only two counties in the State had organized full-time county-wide public health services.

Durham forms the northern vertex of North Carolina's Research Triangle. The unique 4600 acre Research Triangle Park is being developed to provide campus-type sites for industrial and governmental Research Laboratories. The Research Triangle program is recognized as being potentially one of the strongest factors in the State's future economic growth.

1. The Reynolds Award

2. The Rankin Award

3. The Merit Award

- A simple nomination requesting the committee to investigate and provide substantiating data.

For outstanding contributions to public health in North Carolina by a person not employed in public health.
