WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

1. ADULT HEALTH PROMOTION and PUBLIC HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Health Promotion for the Poor in North Carolina — Are We Kidding Ourselves?

A panel presentation and discussion will describe experiences and highlight issues involved in generating and maintaining the vision, popular support, and financial or instrumental means to make health promotion a reality for poor North Carolinians.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

SESSION A

Division of Health Services Update

Speakers will identify the role of the Sanitation Branch in the continuing effort by the Division of Health Services and local health departments to protect and promote public health through mutual environmental health programs, provide a report on the revisions of the North Carolina Rules governing the Sanitation of Restaurants and other Foodhandling Establishments, and share a summary on the new state sewage rules.

Asian Tiger Mosquito

This session will deal with the identification of the asian tiger mosquito and its increasing presence in North Carolina.

SESSION B

Role of Local Government in Protecting the Environment

The speaker will share his views on the responsibilities of local government in protecting the environment. Increased public awareness is leading to stronger demands for proper reactions to environmental concerns.

Ground Water Contamination — Interaction at The State Level

Speakers from the Environmental Sciences Branch of the State Health Laboratory and the Environmental Epidemiology Branch of the Epidemiology Section will provide a scenario of the interaction between these two branches during an investigation of groundwater contamination. With a better understanding of the state's interaction, the sanitarian can plan a critical assistance role.

3. DEVELOPMENTAL REHABILITATION

Toward a True Integration of Services for Developmentally Disabled and Chronically Ill Children

A panel representing various service agencies and parent groups will address the topic. The premise is that true integration of services for special populations can only take place in light of a fully functioning structural network of needed services, and a philosophical and organizational commitment on the part of all actors to sharing and working together on behalf of the child. Controversial issues such as territoriality, conflicting diagnostic opinion, intervention impasses, and case management will be covered. Ample audience participation will be encouraged.

4. LABORATORY

Chemistry Screening — the Rewards and Risks

Since health promotion programs are virtually new and growing in most of North Carolina, this workshop is designed to look at health promotion and the role that chemistry screening plays. Speakers will address (1) how to set up a successful program, (2) how to maintain quality control and proper care and use of screening equipment, and (3) the problems and possible solutions encountered in mass screening. This workshop should appeal to health educators, laboratory personnel, nurses, nursing assistants, and anyone who is involved in a health promotion program.

5. MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

Substance Abuse — Use, Abuse, and Addiction

The purpose of this seminar is to make the audience more aware of addictive personalities. Emphasis will be placed on risk factors, stages of addiction, family roles, intervention, prevention and treatment strategies.

6. MANAGEMENT SUPPORT and PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATION

The Magical Child Within

The speaker teaches classes in leadership, communication, and creative problem solving. She has developed a model for using nature and organic growth cycles as metaphors for personal and organizational development. This presentation builds on childhood memories of "favorite things", celebrates the spirit of the fun-loving and creative child within, and invites this spirit to come out and play. The result is stress reduction through laughter and fun!

7. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Visions of Creative Options

A Medical Social Worker with the Forsyth County Health Department and coordinator of the Teen Talk Program, will share information about girls from low-income families who have had few opportunities to participate in activities that raise their self-esteem. Two representatives of the Teen Talk Program will share their experiences. A family physician in Weldon will share with the group his efforts to unite existing agencies in order to provide a cooperative health care program through the Center for Adolescent Health Development. The Wake Teen Medical Services Director will address his model of clinic specializing in confidential treatment of teenagers. This program is operating out of space in Cameron Village Shopping Center.

NURSING and COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSISTANTS and TECHNICIANS

Public Health — The Chart, the Law and You

This workshop will center around preparation for a suit in the public and private sectors. The main objectives of the workshop will be to prepare the participant for the court room experience and to help the participant prepare a chart that will add to a successful courtroom presentation.

9. NUTRITION

A Multidisciplinary Approach to Cardiac Rehabilitation

The workshop will focus on "Health Kick", a nutrition and health promotion program in Forsyth County. The program emphasizes weight control and preventing cardiovascular disease. It is geared to county employees, as well as the community at large. Also, the Wake Forest Cardiac Rehabilitation Program will be described. This is the first Cardiac Rehabilitation program in the state and serves as a model. Many different health care professionals aid the patient with cardiac disease to become an independent and self-supporting individual.

SOCIAL WORK AND STD

Sexual Abuse of Children

Since the introduction of the concept of the "battered child syndrome" in 1962, medical and public health awareness of child neglect and abuse has grown. However, sexual abuse of children probably remains the most underreported and underdiagnosed type of child abuse. In this workshop, the speakers will discuss this form of child abuse. The medical and legal aspects of the problem will be outlined and highlighted.

11. STATISTICS AND EPIDEMIOLOGY

Public Health Problem of Passive Exposure to Cigarette Smoke

This workshop will emphasize both the scientific evidence and social ramifications related to cigarette smoke exposure to the non-smoking public. The speakers will address the scientific evidence which demonstrates danger to the non-smoker from exposure to side stream and exhaled smoke of smokers, and the social changes now in process to restrict exposure from cigarette smoke to the non-smoking majority. A panel of health professionals involved in policy making on smoking issues will respond to the comments of the speakers, as well as field questions from the audience.

12. STD

Update on the HIV Notification Program

This workshop will discuss the new HIV Notification Program that was implemented in late May and early June. Information will be shared on the activities of the program, as well as any problems that have occurred. Local health department workers will be encouraged to ask questions about their role in this program, their responsibilities as health providers for this program, the role of the HIV Notification Field Workers, and how all of this will work at the local level.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION, INC.

On a warm afternoon, June 16, 1909, the seed of a public health organization was planted. Dr. L. N. Glenn, Superintendent of Health, Gaston County, provided the idea. Dr. Richard H. Lewis, Secretary and Treasurer, N.C. State Board of Health, assisted by county superintendents of health he had summoned for the purpose, earnestly tilled the ground. The Host State Medical Society, meeting in the Battery Park Hotel in

Asheville, benignly added its blessing.

Two years and four days of germination, June 20, 1911, produced a lusty sprout named the North Carolina Health Officers Association. Forty-seven county superintendents of health, eight municipal health officers, and twenty-one members of boards of health met to herald the event at the behest of Dr. Watson R. Rankin during the annual meeting of the State Medical Society in Charlotte. Dr. Richard H. Lewis spoke enthusiastically about "The advantages of a North Carolina Health Officers Association." A Constitution and By-Laws was adopted. Dr. L. B. McBrayer of Asheville was named President; Dr. L. N. Glenn of Gastonia, Vice-President; and Dr. Watson S. Rankins of Raleigh, Secretary-Treasurer. The first prophetic action of this embryonic organization was the passage of a resolution calling upon the conjoint session of the State Board of Health and the State Medical Society to recommend a uniform basis of compensation for health officers for adoption by the County Societies.

As the ranks of public health workers grew, many found that they had no professional home, no forum, no planned association. This problem received prompt recognition and characteristic action from the Health Officers' Association. Meeting in Pinehurst, April 25, 1921, the Association agreed to change its name to the "North Carolina Public Health Association," and the Constitution and By-Laws were amended, opening the membership to all members and employees of boards of health, either state, county, or municipal, and any citizen interested in public health.

Organizational growing pains were felt as membership began to increase. Secretaries found the erudite discussions of the Health Officers remote from the tasks and problems encountered daily. Sanitarians wondered why they should be concerned with the frequency of immunizations when technical matters like measures for the prevention of foodborne disease needed discussion. The creation of scientific sections within the North Carolina Public Health Association solved the problem. Beginning in the 29th Annual Meeting in Pinehurst, 1940, Scientific Sections were formed for Health Officers, Public Health Nurses, Secretaries, and Sanitarians. The Laboratory Section was created two years later. Following in later years were Health Education, Nutrition, Venereal Disease Control, and the Mental Health Section. Two affiliate organizations, the Western North Carolina Public Health Association and Eastern North Carolina Public Health Association and Eastern North Carolina Public Health Association, were accepted in 1960.

Organizational influence has increased and expanded. The joining of the State Legislative Council, then consisting of 19 member organizations, gave the North Carolina Public Health Association four voting representatives in that body and added the voice of public health to that of others in urging passage of needed social legislation. In 1951, through the efforts of Dr. J. W. R. Norton, the NCPHA was formally affiliated with the American Public Health Association, giving the Tar Heel

worker a voice in the formulation of national health policy.

Physical growth has been a vital factor in the total accomplishments and influence of the organizations. From the seventy-six original members of a half-century ago, the

NCPHA, Inc. now boasts a membership of well over fourteen hundred.

Effectively promoting the causes of public health and its practitioners for a half a century, this composite entity called the North Carolina Public Health Association, Inc. confidently faces the future. Fortified by the memory of the dauntless stalwarts of the past, infused with the spirit of the daring present, and excited by the adventure of greater service to the well-being of man, the Association has come to the full bloom of maturity, offering to all who serve and all who are being served a rewarding experience in living for health and healthful living.




