



PROPOSED RESOLUTIONS

PROPOSED RESOLUTION Support of Dietetics/ Nutrition Practice Act

WHEREAS, the Dietetics/ Nutrition Practice Act was established October 1, 1991 by the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, licensure was established to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare and to protect the public from being harmed by unqualified persons; and

WHEREAS, licensure was established to regulate persons engaged in the practice of dietetics/nutrition and to establish educational standards for those persons; and

WHEREAS, licensure will elevate the practice of Dietetics/Nutrition to a professional level comparable to other licensed health professionals; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Nutrition Section of the North Carolina Public Health Association to see the profession of Dietetics/Nutrition recognized as an equal partner in the Health Care Team; BE IT THEREFORE RE-SOLVED, that the North Carolina Public Health Association support the licensure of Dieticians and Nutritionists in North Carolina and support efforts to assure that all individuals who desire to be licensed are given reasonable and cost effective opportunities to do so.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION An Action to Rescind Resolution 1990.01 "Abortion: A Personal Health Service"

WHEREAS, the decision about pregnancy and childbearing are very personal, and private decisions of every responsible woman; and

WHEREAS. **"1990.01** ABORTION: A PER-SONAL HEALTH SER-VICE" is contradictory when it states: "abortion should not be used as a family planning method" and then resolves that "NCPHA b e lieves that individual women and couples should have the means to decide, without compulsion, the number and spacing of their children" and

WHEREAS, abortion is notan "unequivocal right" of every woman; and WHEREAS, Resolution 1990.01 makes statements that have not been adequately studied and/or documented, such as: "women without financial resources who desire abortions seek them from incompetent practitioners or are forced to bear children th ey do not want" implies this occurs all the time and under all conditions which simply is not documented;

THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED that the North Carolina Public Health Association supports the rescinsion of Resolution 1990.01.

For your information when considering the proposed resolution above ("An Action To Rescind Resolution 1990.01"), the original resolution (1990.01) follows:

1990.01 ABORTION: A PERSONAL HEALTH SERVICE

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has legalized abortion in the United States by its decisions in Rowe v. Wade, 93 S. Ct. 705 (1973) and Doe v. Bolton, 93 S. Ct. 739 (1973), and WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has set forth specific guidelines for abortion in its holding, and

WHEREAS, the 1973 Supreme Court decision declared unequivocally the right and guarantee to abortion for all women; and

WHEREAS, abortion should not be used in family planning method and there is no 100% effective contraceptive method, abortion is a choice which enables women to avoid having unwanted childbirth; and

WHEREAS, women without financial resources who desire abortions seek them from incompetent practitioners or are forced to bear children they do not want;

THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED that the North Carolina Public Health Association believes that the right to make decisions about pregnancy and childbearing must remain the personal, private choice of every woman, and

BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that the North Carolina Public Health Association supports the full implementation of the Supreme Court's action in every state in order to make abortion a matter of medical practice everywhere in the nation and in North Carolina; and BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that NCPHA encourages the North Carolina General Assembly to continue to make funds available to poor women for elective abortions; and

BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that abortion is a personal service that should be made available in accordance with the proper standards of health care and with regard for the rights of patients; and

BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that NCPHA believes as a regular part of medical practice, the performance of abortions should be subject to the same regulatory and administrative controls as other medical practices; and

BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that NCPHA believes that individual women and couples should have the means to decide, without compulsion, the number and spacing of their children which is a right that has been supported and enhanced from governmental action at all levels; and

BE IT FURTHER RE-SOLVED that NCPHA believes that abortion should remain legal and it should be made equally available to all, regardless of age, race, marital status, place of residence, or economic situation and that federal and state funds, from Medicaid and other programs, should be provided for women unable to pay for abortion services. Adopted: September 12, 1990

PROPOSED CHANGES IN BYLAWS

1. Membership - There are presently five (5) categories of membership:

Regular Member, Student Member, Life Member, Contributing Member, Retired Member

The proposed change would add a sixth category: First Time Member

First time members shall pay annual dues at a rate of \$10.00 less than regular membership fees as set by the Governing Council. They shall be entitled to all membership privileges including the right to vote, make motions and nominate. to be a member of one or more Sections upon payment of dues, if any, to hold office in the Association (if the qualifications in Article VI are met) and/ or any section. to serve on committees of the Association or Sections: and to attend any educational session during the Annual Meeting.

2. Change in Dues Collection and Fiscal Year

The current wording of the second paragraph of Article IV. FINANCES is as follows:

"All dues are payable at the beginning of the fiscal year, which shall be January 1."

The proposal would change the date from January 1 to October 1. It would further be recommended to extend the discount period for early renewal from six to twelve weeks.

This change would allow the sitting president and executive officers to be responsible for and preside over the entire annual meeting; the new officer would be installed at the annual meeting, but would not actually assume office until October 1: all officers, including the treasurer, would change office October 1st. Presently the treasurer must serve through the end of the fiscal year to close out all financial proceedings. The new president and the full executive committee would have more time to meet and plan for the needs of the Association and the Annual Meeting.

3. Structure and Roles of Elected Officers

The current wording of the first paragraph of Article VI. OFFICERS is as follows:

"The President shall have been a member of the Governing Council of NCPHA or Chairman of a Standing Committee of NCPHA during the past five (5) years."

The proposed change would recommend service on the Executive Committee during the past five (5) years. The proposed change would read as follows:

"The President should have served on the Executive Committee during the past five (5) years."

This proposal ensures that the President-Elect has adequate knowledge of the overall operations of the Association prior to service as President.

4. Publications

The current wording of Article XIV PUBLICA-TIONS is as follows:

All publications of NCPHA shall be issued under the direction of the Governing Council and shall become the property of NCPHA."

It is recommended that the following statements be added to the Bylaws as a requirement to be included in all NCPHA publications:

"Authors alone are responsible for views expressed in signed articles published by the Association. The Association is not to be considered as endorsing the views and opinions advanced by authors of papers published by the association. Advertisers and their agencies will assume liability for the content of all advertisements printed and also assume responsibility for any claims arising therefrom against the publisher."

Hugh A. Barnes Memphis and Shelby County Health Department Memphis, Tennessee

Biographical Sketch Donald M. Hayes, M.D., F.A.C.P. Sara Lee Corporation



Dr. Donald Hayes is corporate medical director of the Sara Lee Corporation, a position he has held since 1987. Prior to that he had been with Burlington Industries, first as medical director and later as director of health and safety. Before joining Burlington Industries in 1979, Dr. Hayes had an extensive career as a teacher and medical practitioner.

A native of Kings Mountain, N.C., he

received his BS degree at Wake Forest in 1951, and his MD at Bowman Gray in 1954. He did his internship and residency in general medicine at the University of Utah, studied psychiatry at the University of Louisville, and took four years as a Fellow in hematology and oncology. He was on the faculty at Bowman Gray 1959-76, and assumed a post at University of Texas in 1976. He has done graduate work at the School of Public Health at Chapel Hill and the University of Illinois. A member of Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Omega Alpha and Sigma XI, he has received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from the Bowman Gray School of Medicine twice.

Dr. Hayes has chaired the Health and Safety Committee of American Textile Manufacturers Institute and has served on the Health Research Committee of the Formaldehyde Institute. Because of his continuing interest in cancer research, Dr. Hayes has been a member of the Board of Scientific Counselors of the National Cancer Institute and is a member at Duke University Medical School and the University of South Carolina School of Medicine and is also an adjunct professor of epidemiology at the University of North Carolina School of Public Health.




