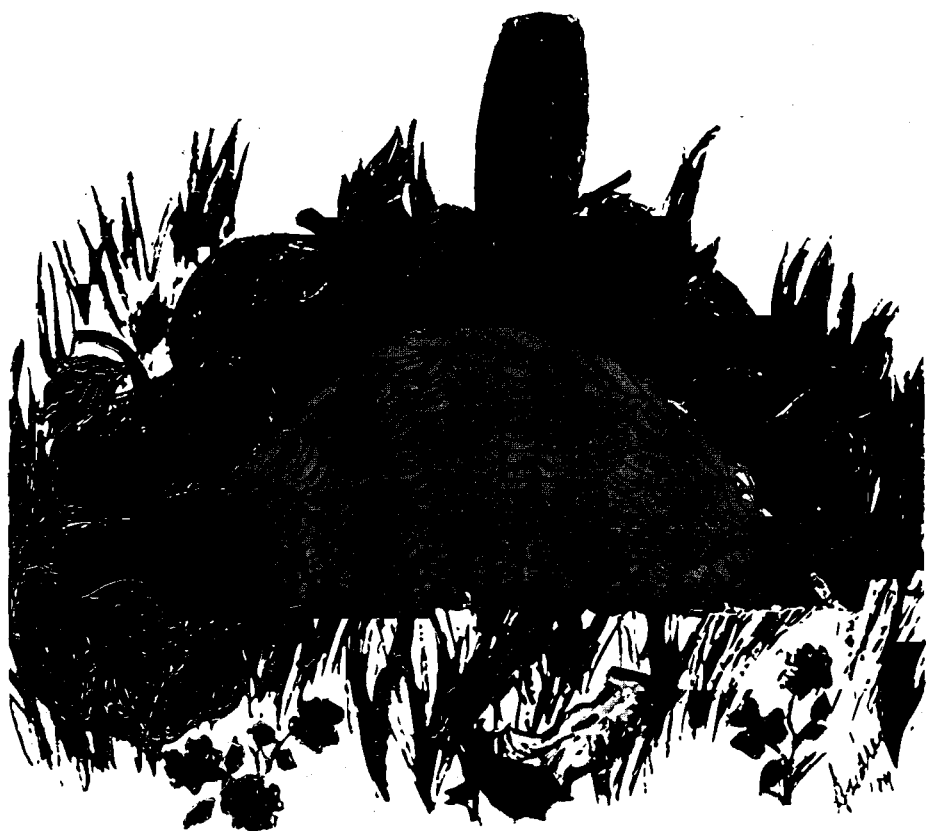

# PROPOSED CHANGES IN NCPHA BYLAWS

The Governing Council of the North Carolina Public Health Association has passed motions that will require by-laws change. These changes will be presented to the membership for approval at the Annual Business Meeting on September 21, 1994 in Asheville, NC.

The Governing Council's recommendations are:

1

To delete the requirement the NCPHA's officers be members of the American Public Health Association.

2

To require that the Affiliate Representative to the American Public Health Association be a member of APHA, that the Southern Health Affiliate Representative be a member of Southern Health and that the Alternate representative to the American Public Health Association be a member of APHA and Southern Health.

3

To require NCPHA to pay the dues of the Affiliate Representatives and the Alternate to the Respective Affiliate organizations.

# NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION

## REYNOLDS AWARD

The Reynolds Medal of Achievement was established in 1948 in honor of Dr. Reynolds and originally was awarded to the person that presented the most outstanding paper at the Annual Meeting of the Association. In 1950, the criteria was changed to include all persons working in the field of public health and no longer required a paper and/or speech. In 1952, the Award was limited to the individual member of the Association who had made the greatest contribution to public health in North Carolina during the past year.

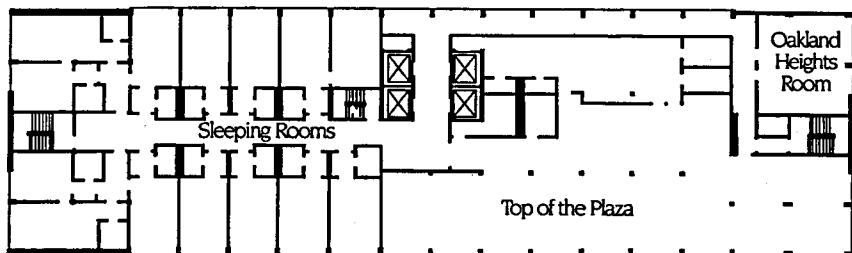




1<sup>ST</sup> FLOOR
