Today, all low income children in Vermont have access to quality health care.

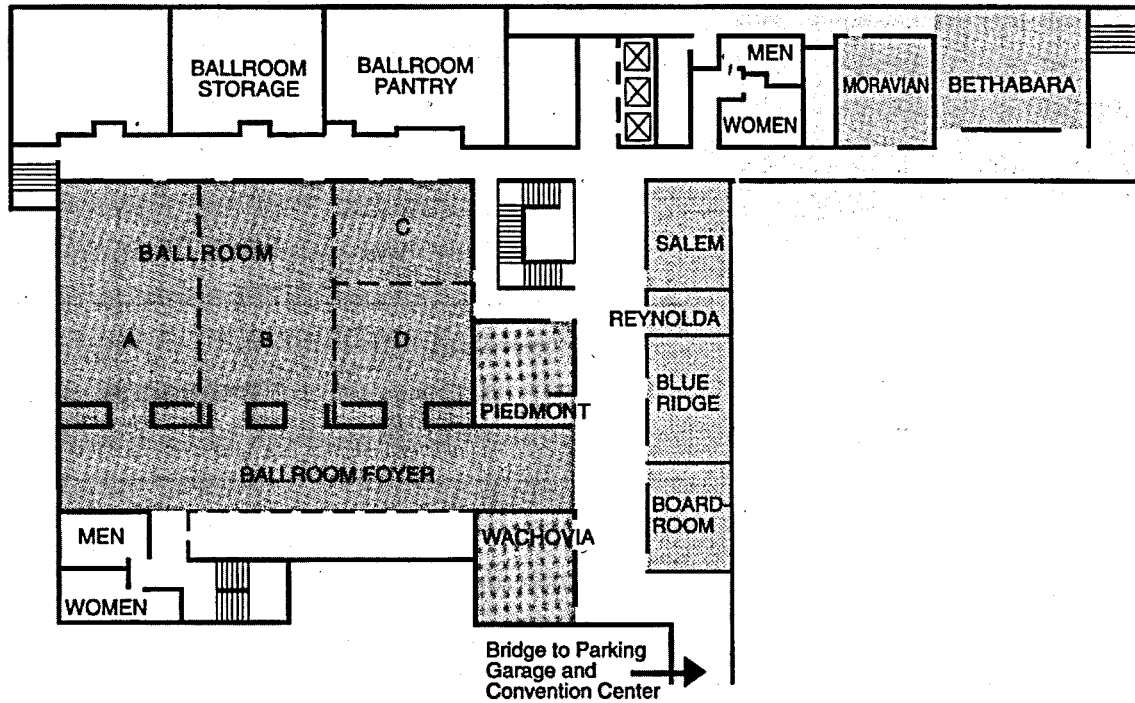
