



BIRTHPLACE OF PUBLIC HEALTH IN NORTH CAROLINA

AND OUR FOUNDING FATHERS



Thomas Fanning Wood, M.D.

Thomas Fanning Wood, founder and organizer of the North Carolina State Board of Health, was born February 23, 1941 in Wilmington, NC. The creation of the State Board of Health on February 12, 1877 can be traced to the dedication and untiring work of Dr. Wood and the North Carolina Medical Society. Therefore, Dr. Wood is known as the "father of public health" in North Carolina. He attended public school in Wilmington and served in the Confederate Army from 1861-1865. While serving in the army, he attended lectures at the Medical College of Virginia after which he served in the Medical Corps. He practiced medicine in Wilmington from 1865 until the time of his death on August 22, 1892. During his 51 years, he served as President of the North Carolina Medical Society and founding member and Vice President of the American Public Health Association. In addition, Dr. Wood founded the North Carolina Medical Journal. As North Carolina's first State Health Officer, he served as Secretary/Treasurer of the State Board of Health. A colleague and fellow member of the North Carolina Medical Society remembered Dr. Wood as follows: "He was gentle and affectionate in his nature, and while he boldly denounced wrong-doing, he never lacked the tenderest charity for the shortcomings of his fellow man or failed to help the weak-hearted or wavering soul."

Edward Jenner Wood was born the son of Dr. Thomas Fanning Wood and Mary S. Wood on July 12, 1878, in Wilmington, NC. He graduated from the University of North Carolina and attended Medical School at the University of Pennsylvania where he Received a M.D. degree in 1902. After spending a year in hospitals in England, he returned to Wilmington and reopened this father's medical office in 1892. He continued to practice medicine in Wilmington until his death on September 16, 1928. In addition to practicing medicine, Dr. Edward Jenner Wood published a pioneering book on pellagra. He spent a year in England studying tropical diseases and was awarded the degree of Doctor of Tropical Medicine in 1921. He served as President of the North Carolina Medical Society and was a member of the State Board of Health from 1913 to 1919. In his remembrance, the North Carolina Medical Society recorded these words, "There is nothing so kindly As kindness, and nothing so royal as truth."






