



Workshop Summary: Overview of new technologies at the State Laboratory of Public Health including:

- Overview of the DPDx digital microscope system, which allows rapid electronic transfer of microscopic images of parasites to the CDC for confirmation of identification.
- Overview of the CDC PulseNet system, which assists in the rapid identification and tracking of outbreaks of foodborne illness by use of genetic mapping.

Dr. Wolf is a Public Health Scientist with the NC State Laboratory of Public Health. She received her B.S. degree in Microbiology from the University of Kentucky, and her Ph.D. in Immunology from the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. Dr. Wolf has co-authored articles that have appeared in the Journal of Clinical Microbiology, the Journal of Immunology, and Cell Biochemistry and Biophysics.

Denise Briggs is a Laboratory Medical Specialist in the Microbiology Unit of the NC State Laboratory of Public Health. She graduated from East Carolina University with a bachelor's degree in Medical Technology. She has over 20 years of experience in the field with 10 years of service with the State Laboratory of Public Health as a technologist and consultant.

"Mad About Cows: Mad Cow Disease and its Clinical Impact"

Dr. John Armitage

Medical Director, American Red Cross

Workshop Summary: This presentation will provide background information about transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs) generally and variant Creutzfeldt Jacob disease (vCJD) specifically. Detailed information will be offered on the new, broad deferrals of blood donors and on the other steps undertaken to safeguard the blood supply. With public awareness of this issue rapidly increasing due to media coverage, 100,000s of donor deferrals, and tightening of the blood supply, public health professionals should anticipate questions and be prepared to answer questions on this topic.

Dr. Armitage is Chief Medical Officer for the Carolinas Blood Services Region of the American Red Cross. He graduated from Duke University School of Medicine and trained as a clinical pathologist and transfusion medicine subspecialist at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas. His areas of interest include piloting programs which leverage blood centers to promote public health education, testing, and referral.

#### Tyler Norris


Tyler Norris is President of Community Initiatives Inc., which provides consultation to organizations and community collaborations with a focus on building healthy and sustainable communities. He also serves as Senior Advisor to the U.S. Coalition for Healthier Cities and Communities, which he helped found. The coalition is a nationwide network of over 1,500 community partnerships and organizations. He served as its Executive Director from its establishment in 1996 through December 1999.

He has helped initiate scores of civic, health and education projects, and is regularly asked to design, develop and facilitate community-based strategic planning, capacity building and problem solving projects. Tyler previously served at the National Civic League as Director of the Civic Assistance Program, and then Senior Associate.

Tyler has worked with a wide range of civic and health-related organizations and collaborative efforts in over 200 communities around the United States and abroad. Past

projects include his founding directorship of the Coalition for Healthier Cities and Communities and the \$9.1 million Colorado Healthy Communities Initiative. He has held leadership roles in community partnership projects with the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, the EPA and Dept. of Agriculture. He is the author of the Healthy Communities Handbook and a co-author of a leading publication on Community Indicators. Norris is a W.K. Kellogg Fellow and a member of the International Health Futures Network.

Tyler has broad experience in the private, public, and nonprofit sectors. In 1992 he helped form Chautauqua International to provide leadership development and planning support to emerging democracies. At the Windstar Foundation he helped initiate 22 citizen leadership organizations in the US, Canada, Japan and Australia. Tyler is a cofounder and served as a five year President of STEP 13, a Denver non-profit human services program, providing opportunity for homeless substance abusers. He is a pilot with over 2300 hours and a graduate of the Colorado College in 1982 with a BA in International Political Economics. He is married and has two young children.




#### Michael E. Bird, MSW, MPH

Michael Bird is a Santo Domingo and San Juan Pueblo Native American from New Mexico. He served in the USPHS Indian Health Service for over twenty years. His most recent position was as Director of Preventive Health Programs with the Santa Fe PHS Hospital in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Bird has a bachelors of science degree in anthropology and a masters of social work from the University of Utah, Salt Lake City. He earned a masters degree in public health from the University of California, Berkeley. He also completed a semester at the University of Hawaii, School of Public Health, Honolulu. Bird has worked in a variety of health programs, including medical social work, substance abuse, health promotion, and hospital program administration.

He has been a member of APHA for 15 years, serving as chair of the Executive Board from 1998 to 1999, before being elected as president-elect of the association in 1999. He was president of the New



Mexico Public Health Association in 1992. In 1996, Bird was a fellow in the USPHS Primary Care Policy Fellowship Program. For six years he served on the board of Healthnet, New Mexico, a campaign to promote the health of New Mexico people.


