

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Welcome to New Bern for the North Carolina Public Health Association's 102nd Annual Educational Conference!



Tyler Norris

Tyler Norris is President of Community Initiatives Inc., which provides consultation to organizations and community collaborations with a focus on building healthy and sustainable communities. He also serves as Senior Advisor to the U.S. Coalition for Healthier Cities and Communities, which he helped found. The coalition is a nationwide network of over 1,500 community partnerships and organizations. He served as its Executive Director from its establishment in 1996 through December 1999.

He has helped initiate scores of civic, health and education projects, and is regularly asked to design, develop and facilitate community-based strategic planning, capacity building and problem solving projects. Tyler previously served at the National Civic League as Director of the Civic Assistance Program, and then Senior Associate.

Tyler has worked with a wide range of civic and health-related organizations and collaborative efforts in over 200 communities around the United States and abroad. Past

projects include his founding directorship of the Coalition for Healthier Cities and Communities and the \$9.1 million Colorado Healthy Communities Initiative. He has held leadership roles in community partnership projects with the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, the EPA and Dept. of Agriculture. He is the author of the Healthy Communities Handbook and a co-author of a leading publication on Community Indicators. Norris is a W.K. Kellogg Fellow and a member of the International Health Futures Network.

Tyler has broad experience in the private, public, and nonprofit sectors. In 1992 he helped form Chautaugua International to provide leadership development and planning support to emerging democracies. At the Windstar Foundation he helped initiate 22 citizen leadership organizations in the US, Canada, Japan and Australia. Tyler is a cofounder and served as a five year President of STEP 13, a Denver non-profit human services program, providing opportunity for homeless substance abusers. He is a pilot with over 2300 hours and a graduate of the Colorado College in 1982 with a BA in International Political Economics. He is married and has two young children.
