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

NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION NORTON GROUP AWARD

In 1951, the Executive Committee of the Association took steps to create its second major award. The Norton Group Awards was established in honor of Dr. John William Roy Norton, who served as State Health Director from 1948-65. 





