1973 ANNUAL MEETING— SEPTEMBER 26-28 (Program included)

The 62nd Annual Meeting of the North Carolina Public Health Association will convene in Raleigh at the Sir Walter Hotel September 26-28, 1973. The theme of the 1973 meeting is *Energy Unlimited*—looking at energy in all-encompassing terms, not just as the dwindling fuel supply.

The keynote speaker for the opening session on Wednesday night will be Dr. William C. Friday, President of the University of North Carolina. Dr. Friday's subject is "Re-energizing America." The second session on Thursday morning will feature three speakers relating to the theme, Energy Unlimited: Dr. Lloyd J. Filer, Jr., Professor, College of Medicine, University of Iowa, will discuss "Growth and Energy." Mr. William S. Lee, Senior Vice President, Duke Power Company, will talk put "Energy Alternatives", and North Carolina's Attorney General, Robert Morgan, will close the session, using the topic "Re-energizing Government to Better Serve the People."

Thursday night the Awards Banquet will be held at the Sir Walter Hotel honoring those persons who have been members of NCPHA 25 years and presenting special awards to individuals who have rendered distinguished service in the health field.

On Friday morning the Legislative Committee and Research and Development Board of NCPHA will present reports to the membership. Following this, Dr. Verna Y. Barefoot, Health Director, Craven County, New Bern, will summarize the general sessions and section meetings. Lieutenant Governor James B. Hunt, Jr. will close the 62nd Meeting, using as his topic, "Reenergizing North Carolina."

The thirteen sections of NCPHA will hold individual or joint meetings on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. The sections have been requested to devote one meeting to the theme of "Re-energizing Public Health" from the section's point of view and to report back to Dr. Barefoot for the Friday morning summary.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT J. S. CANADY

Members of the N.C.P.H.A. became very much disturbed with the discontinuation of federal legislation which has provided financial support for institutions and students in our health delivery system. Federal support for programs preparing students for careers in public health, allied health, and nursing has been invaluable. Under this federally supported program, faculty, curricula and student bodies have been greatly expanded. Many of the graduates have gone into local and state programs where they were desperately needed in agencies providing health services.

The Executive Committee of N.C.P.H.A. passed a resolution supporting legislation for continuation of federal funds for these services. The president was requested to write the two senators and eleven members of the house requesting their support of HR 7806 and S 1136.

The president of N.C.P.H.A. has received replies from all members of congress but one. Those replies received indicated their support of these two bills.

The President signed the bills into law on June 18, which extends the federal support through 1974.

POLICY ACTION ITEMS

The NCPHA Research and Development Board will present recommendations on four public health issues to NCPHA's Governing Council and membership at the Annual Meeting. Four task forces have studied the issues and their reports are the basis of the recommendations.

- I. Role of Local Health Departments in Delivery of Personal Health Services.
 - A. Resolved: That the NCPHA agrees that the initial role of a local health department in the provision of direct personal health services is to participate as an active partner in the development of a primary health care delivery system within its geographical boundary.
 - B. Resolved: That the NCPHA Program Committee consider the topic of the role of the local health department in the delivery of personal health services and in development of primary health care delivery system for its community as a theme for the 1974 Annual Meeting.
 - C. Resolved: That, in implementation of the (Continued on Page 4)



above, the Research and Development Board 1) establish a task force to study the views of major providers of personal health services and of health departments on the role of health departments, and 2) work with the Program Committee to present a program for the total membership representing differing viewpoints and 3) hold small group discussion at the Annual Meeting to generate recommendations for NCPHA.

(Task Force: Gene Barrett, chm; Virginia Addington, Jean Lassiter, Margie Rose, Evelyn Schmidt, Theodore Scurletis, Marjorie Strawn, George Stockbridge.)

- II. Impact on Health Care of Medicaid Reimbursement Policies Regarding Family Nurse Practitioners and Physical Therapy Services.
 - A. Resolved: That NCPHA recommend that 1) changes be made in State Medicaid policy to provide reimbursement for services rendered by qualified physician associates (Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners) working under medical supervision in settings removed from the office of the supervising physician and 2) eligibility for reimbursement be broadly interpreted to encompass a variety of organizational arrangements, including institutions, agencies, clinics, private medical group practices and individual medical practitioners.
 - B. Resolved: That NCPHA bring to the attention of APHA the need for an alteration in the current policy governing Part B Medicare to accommodate the broader use of physician associates and urge APHA to exert such influence as may be appropriate to initiate such a policy change.
 - C. Findings in the area of physical therapy services are under consideration. (Task Force: Margie Rose, Chm.; Audrey Booth, Routh Dixon, Marjorie Land, David McRae, Dan Mosca, John Moore, Elizabeth Holley).
- III. Effect on Nutrition and Dental Health of Permitting Vending Machines in Public Schools.
 - A. Resolved: That, in behalf of the nutrition and dental health of the school age population, NCPHA support the position that only food

and beverages which conform in nutrition quality to that of Type A lunch standards be sold during the school day.

- B. To implement this resolution the President of NCPHA should 1) communicate to the N.C. Congressional delegation the support of NCPHA for federal legislation (Senate Bill 1063, HR-4974) 2) communicate the NCPHA position to the chairman of the N.C. Board of Education and express NCPHA's support of the retention of the administration of school food service programs at the state level and support of the proposed nutritional standards prepared by the N. C. Department of Instruction. (Task Force: Harriett Duncan, Chm., Ralph Eaton, William Satterfield, George Schackelford, and Boyd Switzer.)
- VI. High Toll of Traffic Accidents Among Young Males.

Resolved: That the NCPHA transmit, to the Coordinator of the Governor's Highway Safety Program and other involved agencies, its concern regarding the high mortality rate in young males from traffic accidents, including information regarding the extent of the problem and suggested countermeasures, and offer NCPHA's support in activities geared to reduce this problem. (Task Force: Etra Wood, chm.; Roy Dean, J. P. Johnson, Pat Waller)

Issues for study by the 1974 Research and Development Board will be invited during the Annual Meeting. Individual members or sections should be prepared to identify a pertinent issue and suggest appropriate persons to study it.

PROPOSED ADDITIONS AND CHANGES FOR NCPHA BYLAWS

(Additions or Changes are in Italics)

Article III Membership

(Add to member classification)

"Members in good standing are entitled to all membership privileges, including the right to make motions and vote; to nominate; to be a member of one or more Sections (upon payment of dues if any); to hold office in the Association (if the qualifications in Article VI are met) and/ or any Section; to serve on committees of the Association or Sections; and to attend any educational session during the annual meeting."

Life Member: An individual who has been a member of NCPHA for 30 years, or a health professional who has been a member as long as he has been allowed full membership participation, and has reached 62 years of age may apply for life membership. Application shall be made to the Chairman of the Membership Committee. This committee shall verify the applicant's qualifications and submit names at the Spring Governing Council Meeting for approval. Life membership shall not affect the privileges held by such an individual as a member, but payment of dues will be exempted. "A contributing member shall not have member privileges except for attending educational meetings"...

Article VIII Relationships

Affiliated Districts: Any action of an affiliated district which would involve reference to or participation by the NCPHA shall not be undertaken until it is submitted in writing to and approved by the Executive Committee (instead of Governing Council).

Article X Research and Development Board

Research and Development Board: Shall consist of ten persons representing public health includ-

ing the fields of education, research, planning, legislation, personnel, service and programming. Members shall be appointed by the President for a term of two years and upon ratification, one-half of the members shall be appointed for two years and half for one year. Thereafter, all shall be appointed for a two-year term. The President and President-elect serve as ex-officio members.

Article XI Committees

Manpower Committee: Shall consist of 15 members including one representative from each section with remainder at-large members, all to be appointed by the President. Upon ratification, one-third of the membership shall be appointed for three, two and one-year terms respectively. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for a three-year term. The President shall designate the chairman from the committee members for a term of one year and Manual of Procedures.

Bylaws Committee: Shall consist of three persons appointed by the President. The Secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member of this committee. Public Relations: Shall consist of one or more persons appointed by the President.

Article XII Sections

(Second paragraph) "a written application defining the purpose of the section and a copy of the proposed Bylaws of the section must be presented to the Governing Council for approval A copy of the Bylaws shall be filed with the Secretary (instead of Governing Council). Changes in Section Bylaws shall be approved by the Governing Council.

(Sixth paragraph) Any action which would involve reference to or participation by NCPHA shall not be undertaken until it is submitted in writing to and approved by the Executive Committee (instead of Governing Council).

(Delete paragraph seven)
